My Dear People,

On September 30, 2019, Pope Francis decreed that this Sunday, the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time, should be known as 'The Sunday of the Word of God'. September 30 is the Feast of St Jerome, and that day in 2019 was the 1600th anniversary of the great bible translator's death. He devoted his life to biblical translation because he believed that, as he put it, 'ignorance of Scripture is ignorance of Christ.' He's right of course. It's the reason why hearing passages from Scripture, both read and sung, has always been part of the Mass. Every Mass is a *Biblemass*.

The name of the Holy Father's *motu proprio* (literally 'on his own initiative') inaugurating this Sunday of the Word of God is *Aperuit Illis*. It is taken from St Luke's account of the Risen Lord's appearance to two of his disciples walking to Emmaus. St Luke says, 'he opened their minds (*aperuit illis*) to understand the Scriptures.' What did he open their minds to? The answer is how Scripture (what the Church calls the Old Testament) spoke of Him.

The Old Testament reading today is from the book of Jonah who, in the Sunday School version of the story, was swallowed by a whale and lived in its belly three days. But if we look carefully at the text, it doesn't say anything about a whale – the word used is 'fish' - nor does it say he stayed alive inside it. More likely, from a medical point of view (humans can't live inside marine creatures) is that Jonah died. But how did he come to life again? The answer is to be found in Our Lord's use of the story. He spoke about 'the sign of Jonah' as foreshadowing his own death, burial – *and resurrection*. Jonah was raised from the dead as a sign of Our Lord's resurrection.

St Augustine wrote: 'The OT is the NT concealed. The NT is the OT revealed. Happy Biblemass! **Fr Simon on behalf of Fr Christopher and Fr Ryszard**
