Dear parishioners, this weekend we have a second collection for St George's Cathedral.

For over half a century, St George's Cathedral has been the Mother Church of the Archdiocese of Southwark, home to 175 parishes and over 50,000 Roman Catholics. For many Catholics living and working across London and the South East of England, St George's has been a beacon of light.

Today, St George's Cathedral continues to attract thousands of worshippers and visitors each year, as well as serving a lively local parish community which proudly reflects the rich cultural and ethnic diversity of South London. The Cathedral frequently hosts important Diocesan and national celebrations, as well as concerts and events for various Catholic charities. There is a rich musical tradition, maintaining a choir of boys and men, as well as a girls' choir, both of which sing at Sunday Masses and on major feasts. In many respects, St George's Cathedral serves as a spiritual home and centre for Catholic evangelisation and mission across the Archdiocese of Southwark.

St George's Cathedral is our 'mother' church, even out here on Thanet. When we say 'the cathedral' this is what we are referring to because it is the seat of the bishop of our archdiocese of Southwark, Archbishop John Wilson. Many people wrongly think of 'the cathedral' as Westminster, but that is the cathedral of Westminster Archdiocese. It tends to get all the attention because it is so close to Parliament and government and its Archbishop is a cardinal. But London is divided into three dioceses in fact. Westminster is north of the river, which includes Hertfordshire, Brentwood is in the east and includes Essex while Southwark is south of the river and includes Kent. Ours is a big Diocese and so the Pope grants us assistant bishops one of whom is Bishop Paul Hendricks who assists in Kent. Bishop Paul came to us for confirmations on Advent Sunday. We will soon have another assistant bishop in Gerard Bradley, who will be consecrated a Bishop on 2nd February, Candlemas, in St George's Cathedral.

St George's Cathedral is entirely reliant upon the generosity of its parishioners, volunteers and the Archdiocese of Southwark to keep its doors open. It does not receive Vatican or government funding, nor has an endowment to rely on. Your support can enable the Cathedral to remain open daily to those seeking a place of peace, prayer and worship.
